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## Introduction

Landmark's Freedom Baptist Curriculum is a Bible-based, fundamentally sound, selfpaced curriculum. The curriculum and the organization are unique in the education resource field because LFBC is the only full-line curriculum owned and operated as an integral ministry of a local, fundamental Baptist church. In fact, LFBC is the first and only full-line curriculum for church schools and homeschools ever to hold this distinction.

By full-line we mean that we provide all grades from Pre-Kindergarten through high school with all subjects: Bible, English and Spelling, History/Geography, Literature, Math, and Science, plus electives.
This program has proven itself in hundreds of Christian day schools and homeschools around the world. Teachers and parents find it simple to administer, easy to teach, and true to the Bible. And, it is the most economical self-contained curriculum available today!

## Statement of Faith

The LFBC curriculum is designed to be used by students on their own grade level. Most of the time, students will be able to work independently. However, some activities require teacher assistance, direction, and scoring. By staying involved in the day-to-day activities of each subject, the Teacher/ Parent will be able to stay abreast of the student's progress.

## 36-Week Design

Each Study Guide is divided into 36 weeks of lessons. The student completes one week's work in each of the 36 weeks of the school year. The student then takes a quiz each week in each subject. The lesson planning is already done, making LFBC ideal for the home school! Nine weeks of work represents a grading period. Most middle and upper grade courses contain a quarter test for each of these 9-week periods.

## Flexibility of Use

The 9-week approach and teacherassisted learning features allow the curriculum to be used in a variety of settings, including individualized study centers, teacher-led classrooms, and combinations of the two basic methods. No other curriculum offers this much flexibility.

## Character Development

Academics are not enough; LFBC maintains that character building is more important than facts or skills. We challenge students to become people with character and ability, but we teach them that character is more important.

## Landmark Christian Academy

Landmark Christian Academy is a ministry designed to help homeschoolers with their records keeping tasks and provide limited academic support. It is our desire to make your homeschooling experience as easy as possible.

LCA is available to students in grades from first through twelfth and is able to provide record keeping assistance to parents through a fully accredited program. Report cards are provided twice a year and an achievement test once a year to students.

Landmark Christian Academy is able to provide limited academic support to parents while keeping costs to a minimum. Keeping costs low is a priority for us as is providing quality services.

LCA provides a plan to guide high school students in taking courses necessary for graduation. High school students have transcripts maintained and receive a full high school diploma upon completion of all requirements. We also provide an optional graduation ceremony at our facilities once each year.

## Accreditation

Parents want to know if a school will meet the educational, safety, emotional, and spiritual needs of their children. Accrediting agencies can help verify that schools will meet these needs. It is important that the accrediting agency understands the basic philosophy and uniqueness of an individual school.
Landmark Christian Academy is National Association of Private Schools (NAPS) Accredited. We have chosen to be accredited through NAPS since they understand our program and our
 educational philosophy.

## Record Keeping

Landmark Christian Academy provides report cards twice a year for students in grades $1-12$. The annual achievement test is sent out along with the first semester report card. The second semester report card includes the grades for the whole school year.

High school students enrolled in LCA will have transcripts maintained throughout their high school years. Official transcripts can be used to enter college, transfer to another school, join the military, apply for a job, or any other typical use for a transcript.
Students who complete the high school requirements through LCA will receive a full high school diploma. This diploma is based on the requirements from the state of Florida plus any additional requirements for the student's state of residence.

## Annual Achievement Testing

Annual achievement testing is provided to Landmark Christian Academy students in grades 1-11 as part of the annual academy fee. This test is administered by the parent and graded by certified scorers. This allows parents to test their students at home while maintaining the integrity of the scores. Achievement test scores are maintained in the student's cumulative file..

## LCA Costs

Landmark Christian Academy is extremely economical, charging only an annual fee for the normal six subjects for each student. This helps you by eliminating costly program fees such as registration and matriculation fees, per subject fees, records keeping fees, etc. The annual fee also makes financial records keeping simpler for us, allowing us to keep our costs low.

## Course Plan

LCA uses Landmark's Freedom Baptist Curriculum as its sole curriculum provider.

## Elementary

Our elementary students take one of each of our 6 core subjects each year. The 6 core subjects are as follows: Bible, English, History, Literature, Mathematics, and Science.

## High School

Our high school students are required to meet the state of Florida's requirements plus any additional courses dictated by the student's state of residence. A minimum of 24 credits is required including the following:

Bible (4) - one credit each year enrolled
English (4)
History (3) - U.S. History, World History, \& U.S. Government/Economics
Math (4) - Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, 1 other math credit
Science (3)
Fine Arts (1)
Physical Education (1)
Health (0.5)
Electives (3.5)

## Graduation

Upon completion of all requirements, a student will be graduated from Landmark Christian Academy. Students must complete at least one year (6 credits) with the Academy in order to be graduated.

Graduates will receive a diploma, a hard-back diploma cover, and a tassel. Additionally, our graduates are invited to take part in our graduation ceremony at Landmark Baptist Church in Haines City, Florida. Arrangements and fees are to be made with the Academy office. Please let us know at least 3 months in advance if you plan to participate..

## Discount policy

Landmark's Freedom Baptist Curriculum is a ministry of Landmark Baptist Church in Haines City, Florida. We operate on a ministry budget. We are not a large, well funded curriculum business.

With this in mind, we understand the needs and struggles of other ministries and in particular the men of God who sacrifice to serve Him full time.

## Pastors

In order to be a blessing to families of pastors, we offer a discounted price for our materials with some common sense qualifications. Our intention is to help those in the ministry who are low income and otherwise unable to home school their children. This could include a pastor or whose sole income is from a church but near or below the poverty level, or a bi-vocational pastor whose combined income is near or below the poverty level. We do not require proof of income, but ask that the discount be reserved for those who honestly believe that it is needed for their budget constraints. We do require that some documentation of the worker's position in the ministry be provided for your file, such as a church tract, bulletin, prayer card, etc. Paid church pastoral staff members may qualify as well. Deacons, song leaders, Sunday School teachers, etc. who serve on a volunteer basis do not qualify for the pastoral discount.

## Missionaries/Evangelists

We also extend this discount to missionaries who are on deputation, and to full-time missionaries or evangelists whose support level is insufficient to afford the regular cost of our curriculum.

## Military

Active duty US Military members may apply for a discount. One does not need to be in the ministry in order to qualify for this discount. We appreciate what you do to protect the freedoms we enjoy. We wish we could offer this to all veterans, but are not able to do so.

## Referral bonus policy

Existing LFBC customers who refer new customers are eligible to request one free Complete Subject Set for themselves and one for the new customer. This may be processed at the time of the order, or in the form of a coupon applied to your next order. We are not able to process this as a refund of any previous order. You will need to have the new customer verify with the office that you were the referral when they call for their first order. There is no unreasonable limit to the number of referrals you can make. ## Pre-Kindergarten (K3)



The Pre-Kindergarten program is made up of two major components:

The Teacher's Kit may be reused from year to year. The Student's Kit is consumable, meaning one will have to be purchased for each student each year.

The main academic areas of the Pre-Kindergarten program are as follows:
Bible: Students are taught a Bible verse beginning with each letter of the alphabet. The Teacher/Parent is encouraged to teach the Creation story and to read characterbuilding stories based on figures in the Bible.

Reading Readiness: While not specifically designed to teach reading, the student who completes this program will be thoroughly prepared to learn to read the following year. Reading Readiness incorporates colors, shapes, vocabulary-building pictures, as well as presenting each letter of the alphabet with its phonics sound(s).
Language Concepts: Students' vocabularies will be developed through these activities. Most of the concepts deal with synonyms, antonyms, and prepositions enabling the student to communicate more proficiently, and to be ready to read and understand common words found in many sentences.
Numbers: Students will learn to count by rote, recognize numerals, count objects, and write numbers.

Special Activities: These activities make the LFBC Pre-Kindergarten program flexible and fun. Different activities take place each day in areas such as manners, story rug, music appreciation, art, table play, show and tell, health/safety, literature appreciation, and exercise activities to build coordination.

## Champion Baptist Kindergarten (K5)



The Champion Baptist Kindergarten is made up of two major components:

The main academic areas of the Champion Baptist Kindergarten program are as follows:

Phonics/Reading/Writing: This section is a complete, phonics-based reading and writing program. Students are taught the phonetic sounds of each letter, phonograms (letter blends of consonants and vowels), and rules to remember phonics sounds. Sight Words and McGuffey "Tuffeys," (tricky spellings found in English) which are essential for building the child's reading vocabulary, are introduced throughout the entire year. This section would not be complete without spelling, and the students are required to reproduce dictated words, spelled correctly, at an appropriate level. Course includes the Beginner's Champion Phonics Reader.
Numbers: We start with the basics and take students up through addition of sums of 10. Old-fashioned rote and drill are combined with games, activities, and first-class worksheets for an exciting introduction to arithmetic.

Bible: The alphabet verses are different from the ones learned in the Pre-Kindergarten program. In Weeks 27-36 the students will learn verses containing "precious promises" from God's Holy Word. In addition, instruction is given to the Teacher/Parent for developing the verse into a Bible lesson.

Daily Topics: These activities make the LFBC Champion Baptist Kindergarten totally unique. Brief lessons are presented (on a different subject each day) in safety, health, science, history, and fine arts. During these lessons, the Teacher/Parent may use a wide range of discretion for what would be appropriate with the class or individual student being taught.

## First Grade (105)



## B105 Old Testament Characters - \$50.00

Familiar Bible stories and favorite characters are used in the study of the Old Testament. Each week includes vocabulary, a Bible story, reinforcement activities, and a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E105 English and Spelling 1 - \$50.00

This English and Spelling course is filled with attractive and fun illustrations. It incorporates a well-balanced assortment of language arts and English-writing skills with consistent follow-up and review from week to week. Capitalization, kinds of sentences, correct punctuation at the end of sentences, recognition of simple nouns, verbs, adjectives, and prepositions, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, and alphabetizing of words are all covered throughout the course of the year. A completely phonics-based spelling is used.


## L105 Literature 1 - \$50.00

Review of vowels, consonants, blends, one- and two-vowel words, and recognition and use of all phonics special sounds are included in this beginning Literature course. McGuffey's First Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading. Course now includes the Champion Phonics Reader!


## M105 Mathematics 1 - \$50.00

This year the following topics are covered: number recognition, counting, and writing $1-250$; counting by 2's, 3's, 5's, and 10's; addition facts through 13; subtraction facts through 10; before/after numbers; adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers; recognizing and counting money; telling time to the nearest quarter hour; fractions: one quarter, one half, and one third; and story problems.


## S105 God's Wonderful Creations - \$50.00

This starting point course stimulates the student's interest in science through a study of animals and insects. There are many bright graphics, exciting activities, and thorough reviews.

## Penmanship



## $\overline{\text { 702 }}$ Penmanship ( $2^{\text {nd }}-4^{\text {th }}$ ) $-\$ 40.00$

This elective course offers training in forming all the lower and upper case letters in cursive. The course uses the old-fashioned cursive letters, and is designed for use in multiple grades. The instruction and practice activities allow students to establish beautiful, legible handwriting for life.

Many great men from Abraham's family are used in the study of the history of Israel. Each week begins with vocabulary, and includes a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E110 English and Spelling 2 - \$50.00

Capitalization, kinds of sentences, correct punctuation at the end of sentences, recognition of nouns, verbs, adjectives, and prepositions, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, alphabetizing of words, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## $\overline{\text { H110 }}$ The U.S. Presidents - \$50.00

Every entry about every President includes biographical information, such as birth date, date of death, and period served as President. Also included are sections about each President's heritage, background and family, as well as accomplishments and significant items as President and afterward. Each President's religion is discussed, and special interesting notes are given.


## L110 Literature 2 - \$50.00

Vocabulary words and definitions and comprehension activities are all found in this course. McGuffey's Second Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading.


## $\overline{\text { M110 }}$ Mathematics $\mathbf{2 - \$ 5 0 . 0 0}$

The student will learn the following concepts: addition and subtraction facts through 18; adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers; multiplication and division facts to 5; measurement to one-quarter inch; scale drawings; addition with carrying to 10's place and 100's place; subtraction with borrowing from the 10's place; multiplying and carrying to the 10's place; solving money problems; telling time to the minute; fractions: finding a fraction of a group; and story problems.


## S110 Nature Science - \$50.00

This course on natural science stimulates the student's interest in science through a study of insects, birds, and animals. Wasps, butterflies, moths, grasshoppers, hummingbirds, and beetles are just a few of the topics covered in this course. There are many bright graphics, exciting activities, and thorough reviews.

## Third Grade (115)



## ㅌ115 New Testament Characters \& Stories - \$50.00

Familiar Bible stories and favorite characters are used in the study of the New Testament. Each week begins with vocabulary, and includes a Bible story, reinforcement activities, and a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E115 English and Spelling 3 - \$50.00

Students will develop their ability to think and express their thoughts correctly. Kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognition of nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and prepositions, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, alphabetizing of words, dictionary skills, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H115 Great American Heroes - \$50.00

This text gives the students the right kind of heroes and valuable models of good character to follow, beginning with Christopher Columbus and continuing through the days of the great evangelist, Billy Sunday. Each week begins with vocabulary, and contains Bible memorization appropriate to the subject discussed in the text.

## L115 Literature 3 - \$50.00

Vocabulary words and definitions and comprehension activities are all found in this course. McGuffey's Third Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading.


## $\overline{\text { M115 }}$ Mathematics 3 - \$50.00

Place value of numbers; 3-digit addition with carrying, 3-digit subtraction with borrowing; 2-digit and 3-digit multiplication; 2-digit divisors with checking; multiplication and division tables to 12; telling time; addition and subtraction of fractions; averaging numbers; measurement problems; graphs, and recognizing geometric shapes are all part of this year's work.


## $\overline{\text { S115 }}$ Creation Day-by-Day - \$50.00

This course presents the universe as the direct creation of God. The text presents the six days of creation and gives basic information about the items created on each day. The text and activities present a basic but stimulating coverage of many different areas of science, introducing each as the creation day warrants. Students will also work through several fun and interesting projects.

## Fourth Grade (120)



## $\overline{\text { B120 }}$ Miracles of Christ - \$50.00

The many miracles that Christ performed are used in this study of the New Testament. Each week begins with vocabulary, and includes a Bible story from the life of Christ, reinforcement activities, and a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E120 English and Spelling 4 - \$50.00

Sentence structure, kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognizing and using all eight parts of speech, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, alphabetizing of words, dictionary skills, letter writing, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H120 Our Fifty United States - \$50.00

This study begins with the state of Maine and continues through to Hawaii. Each week involves map activities with the student learning to identify and label major geographical points on the maps. During the last three weeks of the year, the student will complete an outlined project on his/her own home state.


## L120 Literature 4 - \$50.00

Vocabulary words and definitions and comprehension activities are all found in this course. McGuffey's Fourth Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading. Book reports are required every six weeks. Bible memorization is assigned throughout the year with Bible verses pertaining to the moral or practical lesson taught in the week's reading assignments.


## $\overline{\text { M120 }}$ Mathematics 4 - \$50.00

Place value to millions; English and metric measures; perimeter and area; factoring; adding, subtracting, and multiplying fractions; multiplying 3-digit factors; reducing fractions; time lapse; multiples; basic geometric shapes; divisibility rules; reading a thermometer; writing decimals; and word problems are all taught and reviewed.


## S120 Our World: Scientific Facts - \$50.00

This course is an introductory preview of the many facets of the scientific world. Some of the topics are: forms of matter, atoms, magnets, weather, plant life, and animal growth and development. These lessons will prepare the student for future adventures in scientific study.

## Fifth Grade (125)



## B125 The Book of Acts $\mathbf{-} \mathbf{\$ 5 0 . 0 0}$

Acts gives us the first years of the church that Christ established and the history of the early preachers of the Gospel. Each week begins with vocabulary, and includes a Bible story, reinforcement activities, and a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E125 English and Spelling 5 - \$50.00

Sentence structure, kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognizing and diagramming all eight parts of speech, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, dictionary skills, letter writing, thank you notes, writing a research paper, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H125 The Beginner's American History - \$50.00

The text written in the early years of the 20th Century deals with early American heroes from a vantage point much nearer in time than we live today. This text is a treasure of information for our young history students. Each week begins with vocabulary, and many end with a report.


## $\overline{\boxed{L 125}}$ Literature 5 - \$50.00

Vocabulary words and definitions and comprehension activities are all found in this course. McGuffey's Fifth Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading. Book reports are required every six weeks. Bible memorization is assigned throughout the year with Bible verses pertaining to the week's reading assignments.

## $\overline{\text { M125 }}$ Mathematics 5 - $\mathbf{\$ 5 0 . 0 0}$

Place value to billions; rounding off; factoring; multiples; converting measures within the same system; perimeter and area; geometric ideas and shapes; graphs, grids and scale drawings; measurement equations; algebraic equations; 3-digit divisors; 4-digit multiplication; division of decimals; fractions as decimals; and introduction to percent are presented in understandable ways.


## S125 Beginner's Physiology \& Health - \$50.00

This course clearly teaches about a Creator and His special design of the human body. The skeleton, the brain and nerves, the blood and the circulatory system, the special senses, and enemies of good health are just some of the topics covered in this course.

## Sixth Grade (130)



## B130 Bible Survey: Book-by-Book - \$50.00

This course gives a broad overview of the Bible, God's Holy Word. A survey of each book is given. Each week begins with vocabulary, a Bible story, reinforcement activities, and a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


E130 English and Spelling 6 - \$50.00
Sentence structure, kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognizing and diagramming all eight parts of speech, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, using troublesome words correctly, letter writing, thank you notes, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H130 U.S. Geography - \$50.00

This course is a study of the United States and its physical features including mountains, rivers, boundaries of states, cities, and the effect of location on climate, resources, population, and products. Each week has varied projects pertaining to material covered. A variety of illustrations and maps helps the student understand the contents.


## L130 Literature 6 - \$50.00

Vocabulary words and definitions and comprehension activities are all found in this course. McGuffey's Sixth Eclectic Reader is used for reading comprehension and oral reading. Book reports are required every three weeks. Numerous selections of poetry are also included.


## $\overline{\mathrm{M} 130}$ Mathematics $\mathbf{6 - \$ 5 0 . 0 0}$

Place value of whole numbers; rounding off; fractions and decimals: adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing; decimals: changing to fractions; English and metric measures, converting from one metric unit to another; percents as fractions, decimals; measuring angles; graphs; perimeter, area, circumference, and volume; algebraic equations; and integers are all taught.


## S130 Earth Science - \$50.00

Students learn about electricity, magnets, fuels, sounds, climate, water, plants, conservation, and other topics from God's viewpoint.

## Seventh Grade (135)



## $\overline{\text { B135 }}$ The Book of Proverbs - \$50.00

Proverbs deals with many principles concerning young people. Each week has vocabulary, reinforcement activities, a Bible memorization assignment appropriate to the text, and ends with a report on a topic relevant to that week's material.

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## E135 English and Spelling 7 - \$50.00

Sentence structure, kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognizing and diagramming all eight parts of speech, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, using troublesome words correctly, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H135 World Geography - \$50.00

This course is a study of the world and its physical features including mountains, rivers, boundaries of countries, cities, and the effect of location on climate, resources, population, and products. A variety of illustrations and maps are used to help the student better understand the continents and nations of the world.


## L135 Character-Building Stories \& Legends - \$50.00

Many of the selections have historical significance while others illuminate certain phases of living. Still other selections introduce the reader to characters who are eminently worth meeting. Each week contains vocabulary words, comprehension activities, and Bible memorization of a verse pertinent to the moral or practical lesson presented in the reading selection.


## $\overline{\text { M135 }}$ Mathematics 7 - \$50.00

Students review and build on concepts learned: place value; rounding off; addition, subtraction, multiplication, division; English and metric measures; percents: changing to and from fractions and decimals; finding percent of a number; perimeter, area, circumference.


## S135 Biological Science - \$50.00

This course covers the Plant Kingdom, the Animal Kingdom, and the Human Kingdom. The course now includes more detailed material on each kingdom, and has many new pictures to supplement the lessons. Special projects are required in several of the weeks, reinforcing concepts taught.

## Eighth Grade (140)



## $\overline{B 140}$ The Book of Genesis - \$50.00

Genesis gives us a foundation for the rest of the Bible. All major doctrines have their basis in this book. Each week begins with vocabulary, and includes a Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization.


## E140 English and Spelling 8 - \$50.00

Sentence structure, kinds of sentences, punctuation and capitalization rules, recognizing and diagramming all eight parts of speech, contractions, antonyms, homonyms, using troublesome words correctly, and writing compositions are all covered throughout the course of the year.


## H140 Introduction to World History - \$50.00

This course emphasizes the relationship of Biblical principles to the introductory study of World History. Each week contains a section called "What Saith the Scripture" in which the student will apply the Bible to history, or see how Bible prophecies have been fulfilled in history. Bible memorization is assigned each week, and thought questions and reports are assigned regularly.

## $\overline{\underline{L 140}}$ Character-Building Stories \& Biographies - \$50.00

Many of the selections have historical significance while others illuminate certain phases of living. Still other selections introduce the reader to characters who are eminently worth meeting. Each week contains vocabulary words, comprehension activities, and Bible memorization of a verse pertinent to the moral or practical lesson presented in the reading selection.

## M140 Math Foundations/Pre-Algebra - \$50.00

This course includes a review of all mathematical topics. Place value, rounding off; addition, subtraction, multiplication, division; fractions, decimals, percents; graphs; English and metric measures; linear, square, and cubic measure; basic geometric concepts; using formulas; measuring angles; negative numbers; equations; and exponents are taught and reviewed.


## s140 General Science - \$50.00

Students begin their study with a section on the solar system. The course also includes information on water, the earth's crust, weather, and plants. Special projects are required every nine weeks.

## Ninth Grade (145)



## $\overline{\text { B145 }}$ Bible Survey - \$50.00

This course takes students completely through the Bible in a book by book study, dealing with important characters, events, and topics from each book of the Bible. This course will provide an important foundation for continuing Bible study in the high school years.


## E145 English I - \$50.00

This course includes a review of the parts of speech, verb usage, etc., composition beginning with sentences and developing into paragraphs, critical book review, and finally a comprehensive research paper. Literature includes reading and answering questions from 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea (book included in set).


## H145 U.S. History - \$50.00

This course covers American history from exploration to the current culture war. Lessons are covered from a Biblical viewpoint and include vocabulary, memorization, and essay.


## M145 Algebra I - \$50.00

Algebra I is built logically, moving smoothly from one concept to another. Letters are used to represent numbers in expressions and equations. Expressions are simplified and equations are solved. As they work with the axioms, rules and principles of algebra, students are encouraged to use their reasoning ability.


## S145 Physical Science - \$50.00

This course teaches the basics of physical science, including a discussion of the nature of science. It covers the scientific method, physical forces such as gravity and centrifugal force, basic chemical properties of matter, sound, light, heat, and other forms of energy.


## $\overline{\underline{1145}}$ Character-Building Favorites - \$50.00 (Elective)

Many of the selections have historical significance while others illuminate certain phases of living. Still other selections introduce the reader to characters who are eminently worth meeting. Each week contains vocabulary words, comprehension activities, and Bible memorization of a verse pertinent to the moral or practical lesson presented in the reading selection.

## Tenth Grade (150)



## B150 Bible Doctrines - \$50.00

While unashamedly taught from the historical Baptist perspective, this course on doctrine emphasizes what the Word of God has to say on every issue presented. Each week extensive work is done by the student with the Bible. A Bible verse appropriate to the text for memorization is also included.


## E150 English II - \$50.00

Tenth grade English covers parts of speech, punctuation, spelling, capitalization, composition, and literature. It also has guidelines for preparing a research paper. Literature includes reading and answering questions from the collected works of Leo Tolstoy and O. Henry (books included in set).


## H150 World History - \$50.00

This course is a high school treatment of World History. This course covers ancient civilizations, development of modern nations, and recent world events. It presents Biblical philosophies for understanding such issues as origins, nationalism, the rise of unscriptural religions, communism, and the purposes of government.


## M150 Geometry - \$50.00

This is a study of form, position, and magnitude. As the student progresses in this study, he or she will come to a better understanding of the connective thread that ties all parts of this subject together. A knowledge of the vocabulary terms are explained so that the student can have an understanding of them in a geometric sense.


## S150 Biology - \$50.00

This high school biology course covers cellular structure, the chemistry of living tissues, and different phylums of animals and classes of plants. It also discusses the biology and anatomy of the human body, as well as discussing a Christian viewpoint of biology.


## $\underline{\underline{L 150}}$ The Pilgrim's Progress $\mathbf{- \$ 5 0 . 0 0}$ (Elective)

The student's spiritual insights will grow as a result of this year's experience. The writing style and vocabulary also develop the student's ability to read and understand the classic English of the King James Bible period. Each week contains vocabulary words, comprehension activities, and Bible memorization of a verse pertinent to the moral or practical lesson from that week.

## Eleventh Grade (155)



## B155 The Local Church - \$50.00

This course is about the local church: God's plan and program to carry on His work in this world. The text is an "in the trenches" treatise, most of which was written by busy pastors wearing many hats, who have staunch Bible convictions about what they are writing. Each week has vocabulary, reinforcement activities, Bible memory, and a report on a topic relevant to that week's material.


## E155 English III - \$50.00

This course covers grammar, usage, writing, and literature. During the third quarter the student is taught the procedure for writing a formal term paper. Each week covers a specific step in the building process of putting together a high quality finished paper. Literature includes reading and answering questions from Robinson Crusoe and The Scarlet Letter (books included in set).


## M155 Algebra II - \$50.00

Algebra II is built logically, moving smoothly from one concept to another. Letters are used to represent numbers in expressions and equations. Expressions are simplified and equations are solved. As they work with the axioms, rules and principles of algebra, students are encouraged to use their reasoning ability.


## $\overline{\text { S155 }}$ Health \& $\overline{\text { S156 }}$ Dynamic Biblical Living - \$50.00

The first semester includes very practical presentations of the human body. Special emphasis is given to the importance of moral purity, including a study of God's moral code as found in the Scriptures. The second semester deals with issues vital to enabling our Christian young people to develop into solid and mature Bible-knowing and God-loving Christians.


## L155 The Holy War - \$50.00 (Elective)

In The Holy War, Bunyan describes the battle of the ages for the souls of mankind. The spiritual truths taught in Bunyan's book are rich treasures. Each week contains vocabulary words, comprehension activities, and Bible memorization of a verse pertinent to the moral or practical lesson presented in the reading selection.


## H155 Culture War/Current Issues - $\$ 50.00$ (Elective)

This course exposes the truth about America's movement away from the principles of Biblical Christianity upon which it was founded to the relativistic thinking of secular humanism. Each week contains Bible memorization and thought questions, essays, and/or reports. **LCA suggested Eleventh Grade elective

## Twelfth Grade (160)



## $\overline{\mathrm{B} 160}$ The Inspiration of the Scriptures - \$50.00

This course teaches on the preservation of God's Holy Word for the English-speaking world, The Authorized King James Bible of 1611. Each week has vocabulary, reinforcement activities, and a Bible memorization assignment appropriate to the text.


## E160 English IV - \$50.00
